USEFUL HINTS FOR TEACHERS

- at this stage get the dough made at home. If done in class teachers should help them all the time.
- encourage pupils to use their imagination when modeling.
- advice pupils to collect materials like seeds, pulps, dry leaves well in advance.
- When dealing with clay or dough get pupils to bang, roll, push squeeze, oil etc.
- discuss with pupils the people they meet daily
- exchange ideas with partners and in groups.
- encourage them to look at simple structure.
- encourage pupils to use their imagination.
- let pupils make craft work for enjoyment.
- Encourage pupils to use bright colour and paint when making fancy crafts.
- Encourage pupils to make flowers.
- Get them to decorate using flowers.
- Get them to create flowers using their imagination.

- discuss with pupils the people they meet daily
- exchange ideas with partners and in groups.
- encourage pupils to use their imagination.
- Avoid complicated work.
- Encourage correct use of materials and tools.
- let pupils make craft work for enjoyment.
- Encourage pupils to use bright colour and primary coloured paper.
- Teach them how useful any object can be if they can re-use it.
- Encourage pupils to make flowers.
- Get them to decorate using flowers.
- Get them to create flowers using their imagination.
- Get them to cut petals and do flower making

- To encourage pupils to be creative through the making of simple dolls. To develop pupils
 power of observation and expression.
- Know that things found in the environment can be utilized to make useful things.

USEFUL HINTS FOR TEACHERS

- Get pupils to make their own dough.
- Provide them with information that will help them to think about form and structure.
- Pupils should be encouraged to feel the medium they use. When rolling, squeezing, coiling, pushing etc.

- Encourage pupils to use free and imaginative construction of forms.
- Encourage proportions and forms by observing man-made and natural objects.
- guide pupils on how to make papiér maché
- Encourage to recycle material.
- Advise pupils to think about proportion when making toys while keeping to their creativity.
- Investigate tactile qualities in pupils work.
- Encourage pupils to love their environment by making use of found materials and advise them to recycle whatever they can.
- Get them to cut petals and do flower making.
- Encourage pupils to observe flowers for its shape, texture, size etc.
- Get them to make our national flower.

- To develop dexterity and manipulative skills.
- Know that things found in the environment can be utilized to make useful things.

USEFUL HINTS FOR TEACHERS

- Explain and give instructions on how to sculpt/model using different materials.
- Get them to collect straws, eakles, newspaper well in advance.
- Encourage free and imaginative construction while keeping to proportion and form.
- guide pupils when they are make papiér maché
- discuss with pupils the people they meet daily
- exchange ideas with partners and in groups.
- encourage pupils to use their imagination.
- Avoid complicated work.
- Encourage correct use of materials and tools.
- Get them to make things like weights, tin man and containers etc.
- Emphasize basic structure and form.
- Encourage pupils to make and use things out of found materials.
- Encourage them to make crafts like bangles, chains, using polythene bags and empty plastic bottles.
- Get them to keep to some proportion when producing items.

USEFUL HINTS FOR TEACHERS

- Encourage pupils to collect information and pictures on Maldivian culture and history, so as to utilize it in their 3D activities.
- All activities should be planned for doing papiér maché, so that pupils will see that its not just a making of simple objects but also a constructive process.
- Emphasize basic structure and forms.
- Encourage pupils to see picture of sculpted, natural, manufactured etc.
- help pupils to research on the chosen theme or topic.
- help and encourage pupils explore and experiment on with different ways of making objects using variety of media.
- Demonstrate on how to make flowers using polythene bags.
- Get them to arrange shells to make flowers.
- advice pupils to observe the natural forms for making flowers.
- Emphasize structure and forms of different objects.
- Encourage creativity .
- demonstrate on how to make cloth flowers.
- Encourage pupils in making flower vases and other decorations using flowers.
- Encourage on making items using polythene bags.
