LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the completion of grade 1 the child should be able to;

- Use basic materials such as bristle board, gum, unused paper etc. and explore them in
- producing paper craft.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- To encourage children to make use of waste paper.
- To provide enjoyment for pupils in hat - making activity.
- To learn simple paper folding.
- To transform recognised shapes into design by paper cutting.
- To encourage pupils to create interesting pictures using scrap materials.
- To encourage pupils to make simple toys from scrap materials.
- To provide enjoyment in paper craft.
- Learn balance in making small mobile items

SUGGESTED TOPICS/ ACTIVITIES

Suggested activities:

FOLDING AND CUTTING by

- plaiting and pleating
- b-concertina folding
- making lanterns

ORIGAMI'S (simple folding)

Suggested topics:

- houses
- boats

MASKS(tearing and pasting)

- using paper plate

MOBILES

- tearing and cutting shapes

SUGGESTED MATERIALS

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- To make a repeat pattern or a symmetrical motif by cutting folded paper.
- To encourage children to make use of waste paper.
- To learn simple paper folding.
- To transform recognised shapes into design by paper cutting.
- To provide enjoyment for pupils in the making of simple masks for certain occasions.
- To encourage the making of simple masks of animals that pupils are familiar with.
- To encourage pupils to make toys from scrap materials.
- Learn balance in making small mobile items

SUGGESTED TOPICS/ ACTIVITIES

Suggested activities:

FOLDING CUTTING AND TEARING

- plaiting and pleating
- wind mills
- making lanterns
- expanding body of animals

ORIGAMI'S (simple folding)

Suggested topics:

- simple flowers
- boats
- animals

MASKS using

- paper plate
- cut shapes

MOBILES

- tearing and cutting shapes
- stripes of paper

SUGGESTED MATERIALS

- different types of paper e.g.: glaze paper, crepe paper, cartridge paper, news paper, drawing paper, bristle board, coloured paper, etc. coloured cellophane paper, other different types of papers like glittering
- paper, cigarette box paper etc.

USEFUL HINTS FOR TEACHERS

- get them to fold and cut in order to get different patterns.
- try out different ways of folding paper.
- encourage pupils to use different shape and textural material for cutting and pleating
- teach them the importance of pleating evenly.
- demonstrate on how to fold correctly.
- Encourage them to pleat using different amount of paper.
- encourage pupils to make us of waste paper at home and in school.
- encourage pupils to make masks for play activities.
- get them to use different bright colour coloured paper to make it interesting while making masks.
- encourage pupils to make masks colourfully.
- let them be aware of the balance needed in a mobile.
- encourage pupils to decorate mobiles using scrap materials.

PAPER WORK GRADE 3

LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the completion of grade 1 the child should be able to;

- Use experience and imagination while doing paper craft
- Make choices about materials in the paper craft work and organise them in expressive ways.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- To make a repeat pattern or a symmetrical motif by cutting folded paper.
- To encourage children to make use of waste paper.
- To give pupils the opportunity to develop their manipulative skills.
- To inculcate a sense of balance and movement through planning and designing of mobiles.
- To give pupils an opportunity to create a character associated with stories they have read.
- Develop ideas in decoration.
- To encourage creativity in pupils to make simple toys from scrap materials.
- To discover that design can be repeated by cutting or tearing folded paper or by using scrap materials.
- To make a repeat pattern or a symmetrical motif by cutting folded paper.

- paper, cigarette box paper etc.
- paste glue, gum and other adhesives.
- egg cartons, boxes, paper plates, and other found materials.

USEFUL HINTS FOR TEACHERS

- Get them to cut on their own to make interesting expanded patterns.
- teach them the importance of pleating evenly.
- pupils may use these types of decorations to decorate at home in school.
- pieces should be joined and overlapped to keep the tension.
- Get them to use coloured glazed paper and origami paper to make origami's.
- Emphasise pupils to fold evenly to make a balanced origami.
- Teach them the importance of valley and mountain fold in an origami.
- encourage pupils to make masks for play activities.
- get them to use different bright colour coloured paper to make it interesting while making masks.
- let them be aware of the balance needed in a mobile.
- encourage pupils to decorate mobiles using scrap materials.
- Advice them to fold and cut on a guide line to get the proper shape

LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the completion of grade 1 the child should be able to;

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- To inculcate a sense of balance and movement through planning and designing paper craft.
- To make an item for home decoration / personal use.
- To learn how to construct simple interesting objects with different types of paper.
- To provide children with an opportunity to enjoy making paper crafts.
- To enable pupils to have fun while doing paper batik.
- To encourage pupils to be inventive, imaginative and resourceful in the use of materials provided.
- To use the idea of counter changing tones to make a paper mosaic.
- To encourage creativity in pupils to make toys from scrap materials.
- To satisfy pupils innate desire to express themselves.

Develop ideas in decoration.
To encourage creativity in pupils to make interesting toys from scrap materials.
To train pupils in inventiveness, resourcefulness and improvisation.
